### THE STORY OF PRAIRIE UNITY

The Prairie Unity Pow Wow was born from a shared vision between Dakota Plains Wahpeton Nation, Long Plain First Nation, and the City of Portage la Prairie through the First Nation-Municipal Community Economic Development Initiative (CEDI).





As our first joint initiative, the Pow Wow marks a historic gathering of strength, spirit, and shared identity. Together, our communities wanted to create a space where everyone could gather, learn, and celebrate side by side.

The Prairie Unity logo reflects that partnership by incorporating the Medicine Wheel alongside visual elements from each community: cattails and reeds from the City of Portage la Prairie, feathers from Long Plain First Nation, and a Dakota cultural design from Dakota Plains Wahpeton Nation. Together, these symbols form a circle and a reminder that collaboration, respect, and understanding have no beginning or end.

Sophia is a proud member of the Dakota Plains Wahpeton Oyate, descending from a line of Hereditary Chiefs. She is both Wahpetonwan and Sisseton Dakota, and has been dancing since she was just 3 years old.

Sophia wears the jingle dress to honour her Ojibway family on her maternal side, carrying the strength and healing that the dress represents. A Dakota language speaker and aspiring historian, Sophia is passionate about helping youth grow strong roots in their cultural identity and pride.

#### **Meet our Head Man: Maurice Meeches**

## Tatanka Ska Tokata Inajin - "White Buffalo Standing in Front"



Maurice is a proud member of Long Plain First Nation, with roots that also trace to Sioux Valley Dakota Oyate. Now living in Whitefish Bay Anishinaabe Nation in Ontario, Maurice comes from a long lineage of grass dancers on both sides of his family.

He began dancing at just 3 years old beside his father - carrying forward the teachings and traditions passed down from his grandfathers and Unkan. Today, Maurice shares that knowledge across Canada and the U.S., and continues to instill the importance of culture and tradition with his own children and youth in our communities.

Our Head Man, Maurice Meeches, invites all Men's Grass Dancers to join him and his family at Prairie Unity Pow Wow, where they will be hosting a Men's Grass Dance Special. Old Style, Original Style, Contemporary... everyone is welcome.

Maurice's message is simple: "Come out, dance, and have fun."

## POW WOW KNOW HOW

Pow wows are for everyone and are one of the best ways to experience First Nations culture first hand. They are a beautiful, vibrant celebrations where many tribes come together to sing, dance and catch up with friends and relatives.

If you have never attended a pow wow, here are a couple of helpful tips for first timers and some rules of ours to follow;

- Doors open 2 hours before Grand Entry
- All bags WILL be checked thoroughly
- Children 12 and under MUST be accompanied by an adult at all times
- **Listen to the MC:** The Master of Ceremonies will explain the schedule, announce specific songs, and give instructions on when to stand, sit, and when guests can dance, or when photography may be prohibited
- Regalia vs. Costume: Dancers wear regalia, which holds deep cultural and spiritual significance, not "costumes." Do not touch a dancer's regalia, hair, or drums without explicit permission.
- Photography: Always ask for permission before taking pictures or video of individuals.
   Photography may be prohibited during certain sacred moments, prayers, or honour songs.

- The Dance Arena: The center dance arena is reserved for dancing or walking in inter-tribal songs.
   Do not walk across it or let children play in it.
- Seating: There are generally areas reserved for elders, dancers, and drummers. Sometimes dancers will save their seats with a blanket. Be mindful of allowing people space for their feathers etc.
- **Drugs and Alcohol:** Pow wows are strictly drug and alcohol-free events. Individuals under the influence will be asked to leave.
- Pets: Pets are not permitted in the pow wow arena.
   Service animals are generally welcome.
- Fallen Feathers: If an eagle feather is dropped the MC or Arena Director will immediately request an elder or other person to retrieve. This requires a specific, respectful ceremony and must not be recorded.
- Inter-tribal Dances: When the MC announces an "inter-tribal" song, everyone is invited to join the dance.
- **Support Vendors:** Purchasing food and crafts from the local artisans and food vendors supports Indigenous families and communities.

**If at any time you are uncertain** of procedure or etiquette, please check with the MC, Arena Director, or host drum or head dancers. They will be glad to help you with your questions.
